Speaking of dances the activity committee has three of the best bands in Yuma trading off Saturdays. Keep your dance shoes polished and come in and join us.

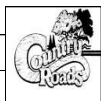

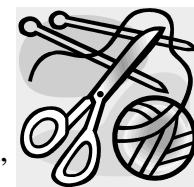

Why not let a friend drive your cart the other night, that way we will have the maximum carts out each night. So mark your calendars and If you are not able to join us in the Parade, please make sure to cheer us on as we go by.

ELECTION 2011 A FEW CHANGES FOR THIS COMING ELECTION

It was brought to my attention by Vice President Mark Nissell that he felt campaign signs had caused some unrest among our homeowners last year. In talking with others they have confirmed this feeling. In fact some have said they will no longer have campaign signs in their yard. Therefore, in an effort to help ease the dissension and division among our homeowners the Election Committee has asked the Board of Directors to ban the use of campaign signs this year. The signs will not be allowed, however campaign badges will be allowed and the following guide lines need to be followed by those wearing the campaign badges.

Campaign badges are not to be worn by volunteers while they are performing their volunteer duties on Association (common) Property.

During Board Meetings and Homeowners meetings Campaign badges are not to be worn by current board members.

This year we have condensed the "Meet the Candidates" forum to one session which will be held on **December 13, 2010, 1:00 PM in the ballroom.** Previously we reported there would also be one in January. When the Election Committee reviewed last year's two sessions we realized the one in January was not well attended and also there were very few questions asked. The deadline for the election committee to receive your questions is Monday December 6, 2010.

Something else that will be different this year is the time the voting polls will be open the day of The Annual Meeting, January 11, 2011.

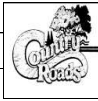
