## MANAGER'S NEWS

As your new Community Manager, I would like to take this opportunity to say how grateful I am to be here and assist you all with your lovely community. I am so impressed with the Park and its amenities, activities, staff and wonderful residents that I have met thus far. I look forward to meeting you all as season arrives. I also intend to assist all of you in keeping Country Roads the most desired place in Yuma.

For those of whom I have not yet had the pleasure of meeting, I have moved to Yuma from Florida. I am originally from North Carolina. I have made Community Management my career and have been in this business for over twenty years. I am a new employee to City Property Management and I am excited to bring with me the support of such a wonderful Community Management Corporation.

I realize that many have yet to see the new Laundry operation for payment. The new design will eliminate the use of coins. You will need to arrange to stop in the Homeowner's office and 'load' money (bring into the office with you five dollar bills, ten dollar bills or twenty) onto a card that is the size of a credit card. Then you will simply take this card to the laundry room and instructions are there as to the operation of the ma-

chines. The WEB Card, as it is referred to, will hold up to \$40.00. The important thing to remember is to plan in advance so that the office is not closed when you wish to do your laundry.

A portion of my job and service to the community is to perform regular inspections to make certain there are no violations. It is important to remember that if you receive a letter from me requesting that something be addressed, there is no need to become anxious or upset. I never single anyone out, I am simply seeing to it that all Rules are adhered to and the property is properly maintained. My philosophy is to be available should you have any questions or concerns so do not hesitate to contact me.

I would like to encourage all to notify the office if you have a maintenance item that needs to be addressed. There is no need to wait to tell a Board member or Committee member. My office needs to be made aware so that we may resolve it quickly. If you have a complaint to lodge, we have written complaint forms at the office which are necessary when reporting items that are not of a general maintenance nature and I always make every effort to keep your anonymity.

If Margaret and Rose think there will be enough people in the park for us to have our first Potluck in October, we will put a notice on the Bulletin Boards.

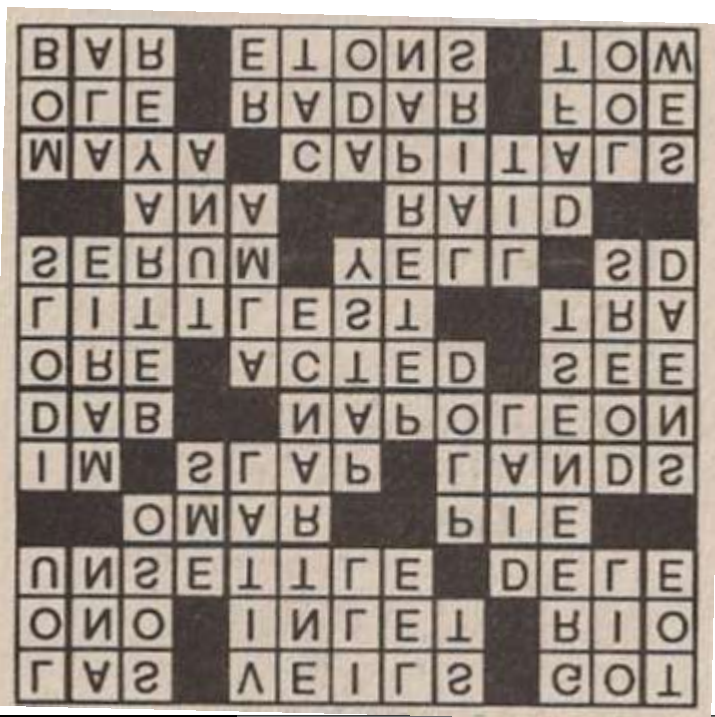
