

Sinatra and Friends —

When he was growing up, Sean Griffin could not stand his parents' choices of music. They listened to the likes of Frank Sinatra, Glenn Miller, Al Jolsen, Billie Holiday and more. He couldn't get them to appreciate the brilliance of "In a Gadda Da Vida," which Sean listened to incessantly.

Something changed one night 25 years ago, when an elderly retired fisherman who lived next door invited him to bring his guitar to a party. He provided a binder with sheet music for Sean so Sean could accompany him and others. Accustomed to the simple, three-chord and four-chord progressions in rock'n'roll, rhythm and blues and folk music, he was astonished by the complex chord progressions in songs like "As Time Goes By" and "Button Up Your Overcoat."

The sheer number and complexity of the chord progressions gave me a sudden and lasting appreciation for music for the era of the 30s and 40s — often known as Tin Pan Alley," he said.

In his 60s, when he discovered karaoke, Sean began singing some of the tunes, and many became his favorites. In 2002, at Country Roads, he offered his first " (continued..)

crooning" concert, and it's become an annual event. This year's concert will take place 11 am to 1 pm, March 11, at the covered patio outside the cafe. Singers whose work he will emulate include Fats Waller, Tony Bennett, Bing Crosby, Fred Astaire, Frank Sinatra, Al Jolson, Louis Prima, Glenn Miller, Jimmy Durante, Cab Calloway, and Doris Day.

Prizes given for BEST dressed couple, (or single!) and BEST decorated table.


