CR Articles Document(1984) has 2 conflicts with our practices & other Documents Articles require our Annual Meeting and election of BOD members to be held the first Wednesday of September. That would be Sept 7, 2022 when most of us are not in the Park. Articles state that "Neither the Board nor the officers need be a member (owner) of the Association (CR)" These 2 items conflict with our CC& R's, By-Laws and current practices. The BOD and our HOA Attorney recommend that HO's consent to make these changes in the Articles.

Please sign & return your consent formor discuss your questions with a BOD member. Also, please remind your friends to complete their consent.

Thanks to those who have consented, we have received 618 approvals as of 11/19. 75% of owners (968) must consent to approve the 2 changes in the Articles. 350 more are needed.

Please help avoid questions or conflict - allow us to assure CR legal documents match the ways we function.

All requests for any changes or improvements to your lot must have prior written consent of the ACC (Architectural Control Committee). The lot improvement form is available at the Homeowner's office outside the front door. The form should be drawn to scale to show your lot, what is currently on it, and the proposed changes. If you are unsure how to complete this form, or what your lot size is, the ACC member on duty that day (Monday-Friday) will be able to assist you. The office will provide you with the contact information for the ACC member on duty that day. There are currently 8 ACC members that volunteer their time two days a week. Each member attends the regular Wednesday meeting and also has an on duty day. The ACC meets weekly on Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. This weekly meeting is an open meeting, and all are welcome to attend. Due to room capacity, seating will be limited. ACC members will be available to assist you with any questions at the conclusion of the Wednesday weekly meeting, or on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Fridays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. with an appointment. 




Whole Food, Plant-Based Lifestyle Group

ELECTION NEWS DECEMBER IS HERE!!

If this is your first time on the website, click on "Create Account" you will need the pass code from the office and then create your own password. Otherwise click on "Login." Put in your e-mail and password. 5. Go to the tabs on the left "My Account" scroll down to "Account Setting & My Contact Info. You will see there are many things you can do there, check your email, mailing address, phone number, emergency contact, and more. PLEASE be sure your mailing address is correct for January 14, 2022. That is the address where vour ballot will be mailed.
