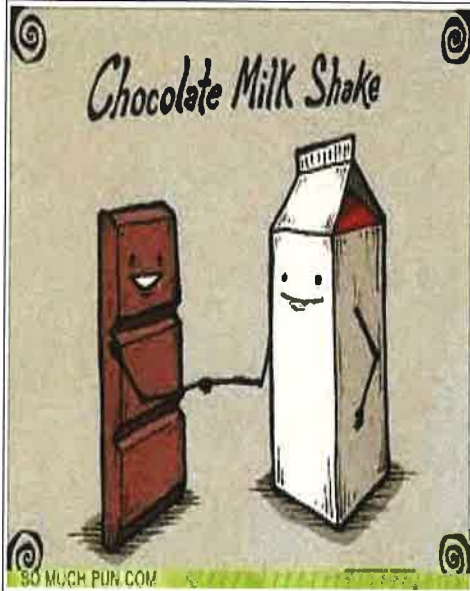

We are SO blessed to live in an amazing resort with SO many wonderful amenities and yet we pay some of the lowest HOA fees of any other park in our area. I think this is possible in part because of the ever present spirit of volunteerism of our homeowners and renters. Volunteers are our lifeblood but equally important are all of you who attend the FUNd raising events (and we hope it has been FUN). The Building Fund committee was created to sponsor and oversee fund raising events (also run by volunteers) and then to disperse those funds to clubs, organizations and groups within the park to help them purchase items they need to enhance their activity. The Building Fund has also been fortunate to receive donations from clubs and individuals as well. Since 2007, the Building Fund has dispersed \$635,054.82 to Country Roads clubs and organizations including \$58,376.53 allocated so far in the 2024-2025 season. This is an impressive amount of money that provided many upgrades to the park that may not have happened without raising our HOA’s.

Having said all that, it is important to note that the Building Fund Executive Committee is comprised of 6 positions, 4 of which are open for the coming season (3 positions will be 2 year terms and 1 position will be a 1 year term due to a resignation). Homeowners in good standing are eligible to run for a position on the executive committee.

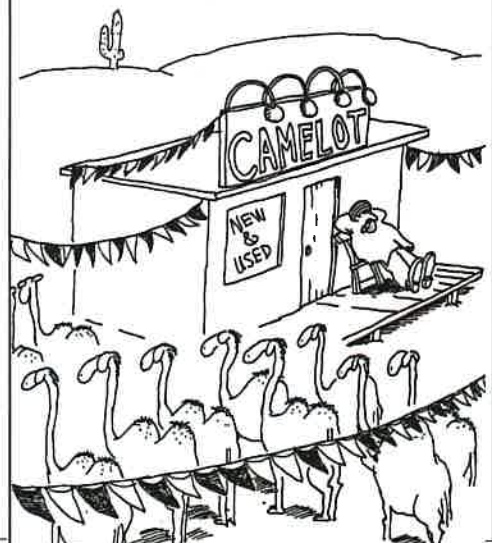

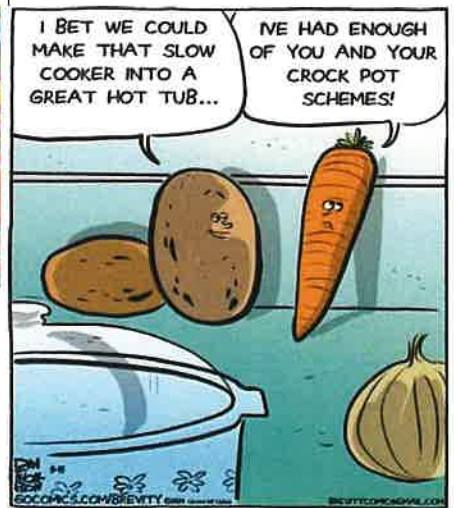
ELECTION NEWS
