We discussed some of the building codes and setbacks required by the city. They answered questions that we had and helped clarify some issues. ELECTION NEWS

It isn't too late; if you hurry you still have time to turn in your resume as a candidate for the Country Roads Board of Directors. JANUARY 13, 4:00 PM is the deadline to have your resume into the Homeowners' office. WE NEED YOU!!! Are you communicative, do you have basic computer skills, do you like people and get along with others? If you are a homeowner in good standing you just might be a good candidate. There are three open positions which are three-year terms. How about it, turn in your resume, 1 page 250 words or less, January 13, 4:00 PM is the deadline for that resume. Photos of the candidates will be taken at that same time.

A few reminders about campaign guidelines and instructions in our park.

Campaigning may start January 14, 2020 the day after the resume deadline.

No campaign signs of any kind are allowed in our park, ie: on properties or golf carts.

Campaign badges are not to be worn by volunteers, or displayed, as they perform their volunteer duties on Association (common) Property

We encourage you to attend the Meet the Candidates Forum February 10, 1:00PM in the ballroom. Please mark your calendar. You may think you know the candidates, but do you really know all of them and their views. So, mark your calendar and become an informed voter BEFORE YOU VOTE. **Once a ballot has been cast in the ballot box it is irrevocable.** The ballots will be mailed out January 27.

IMPORTANT ITEM: DAY OF RECORD WILL BE JANUARY 24. To be eligible to vote your account must be current on that day, January 24. All monthly assessments, work orders or fines must be paid. The homeowner on that day, January 24, is the homeowner eligible to vote. Therefore, if a property is sold in February, the new homeowner is NOT eligible to vote.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT POINT: January 17 is the deadline for you to give the homeowners office the address where you want your ballot mailed. For multiple lot owners, each lot you own must have the address where you want that ballot mailed to. The ballots will be mailed to the address on record. When you arrived and checked in at the H.O. office and changed your address to Country Roads that is not a change of address for the U.S. Post Office. You still must fill out a change of address for the U.S. Post office to have your mail delivered to Country Roads.

You can check your own mailing address on the City Property Website. (If you have your account established with your e-mail and password) If you don't the office can give you a passcode.

Click on Portals, in the drop-down box click on "Homeowners Portal.

On the left click on the "LOG IN" button put in your user ID and password

On the left under "My Account" click on "Account settings & my contact info"

Scroll down to your mailing address and check it out. The address showing is where all Country Roads/City Property correspondence will be sent.

If this is not correct, hit the "Change" button and change it.

You can also check out your e-mail address in this same portal, maybe it needs to be changed. This Portal is also where you can vote electronically for this year's election. We hope you will do that.

There is still time to submit your resume as a candidate for the Board of Directors. (One page not to exceed 250 words) Resume deadline is January 13, 2020 4:00 PM, delivered to the Homeowner's office. Give us a choice lets have multiple candidates! Pictures of candidates will be taken at that time.
