In February, we will have our birthday give away, which gives each player a free 15th game card depending on the their birthday month. You must bring ID to get your free card.


If born Jan, Feb or March - you get your free card on Feb 7

The day the ballots are stuffed, Jan 19, the committee will pull out USING THE FORM, those lots that are to be picked up. All other ballots will be mailed the following day

The ballots can be picked up in the Board Room, across from the Welcome Center, January 19, 1:00-3:45 PM, January 20, 9:00 AM-3:45, January 23, NOON - 3:45 PM DO NOT GO TO THE HOMEOWNERS' OFFICE, THEY WILL NOT HAVE YOUR BALLOT
